Ronald W Anthony

Wood scientist and conservation expert based in Colorado, USA. Author of the Association for Preservation Technology (APT) technical publications *Basics of Wood Inspection: Considerations for Historic Preservation* (2007) and *Nondestructive Evaluation: Wood* (2010).

Ronald W Anthony has applied innovative inspection technologies to the assessment of wood in historic structures since 1985. His projects in the USA include the Shenandoah-Dives Mill and Tram Terminal; the Hanging Flume (on the 2006 World Monuments Fund Watch List); Benjamin Latrobe's Basilica of the Assumption in Baltimore; the Breeding Barn at Shelburne Farms; and Gustav Stickley's Craftsman Farms in New Jersey. He has authored approximately 85 publications, participated in conferences and seminars, and consulted throughout North America, Europe, Asia, Africa, Australia and the South Pacific.

Gulf Station is one of the oldest and most intact timber farm complexes in Australia—built in the 1850s with homestead and original outbuildings including barn, dairy, schoolhouse and butcher shop. Gulf Station is located at 1029 Melba Highway, Yarra Glen, Victoria. (Note that Gulf Station is currently closed to enable extensive conservation work and interpretation supported by Heritage Victoria and with the support of the Federal Government through the 'Heritage Projects Jobs Fund'. Gulf Station will re-open to the public on 14th March 2011.)
